MEMBERSHIP REPORT Barbara Rozavsky, HonNEC

As of May 21, 2025, there are 55 clubs that are active NECCC members. In the past year, 1 club disbanded, 2 chose not to participate, and 1 club never responded to several e-mails sent. The distribution by state is as follows: CT, 18; MA, 27; ME, 3; NH, 5; RI, 1; VT, 0; and 1 for New England.

For the 2025–2026 season, club dues will remain the same. The rates are as follows: \$15.00/year for 1 to 50 members \$35.00/year for 51 to 99 members \$50.00/year for 100 or more members

The fee for participating in the Digital Interclub Competitions can be made at the same time as dues are paid.

Having the correct information about each club's officers—in particular, the club rep, president, treasurer, and the person in your club that sends out communications to your club members—is very important. To help the process, in late May I sent out reminders about filling out the data form as soon as possible after your club elections take place. Even if there are no changes in any of your info, please fill in the requested info completely. Dues reminders will be sent out in late August. I am hoping that this new process will allow the dues notices to go to the correct person in each club.

When the new NECCC website goes live sometime this summer, none of the info (officers 'addresses, phone numbers, and such) will be shown online. It is mainly for NECCC committee use. Also, anyone looking for a club in his or her area will be directed to your website so that info is more important now. If your club doesn't have a website, note that in your form and we will have individuals contact me so I can send the inquiry to your NECCC rep to handle.

INDIVIDUAL PRINT COMPETITIONS

The Spring 2025 NECCC Individual Print Competition was held at the Greater Lynn Photographic Association on Saturday March 29th, 2025. Fifty entrants from thirteen NECCC Camera clubs submitted a total of eighty-eight prints, forty-two prints in the Monochrome print competition and forty-six prints in the Color print competition.

The Judges for the Spring 2025 Competition were Michael Goodman, MNEC from the Seacoast Camera Club and GLPA, Tara Marshall from the Photographic Society of Rhode Island and Daniel Carey, MNEC from Nashoba Valley Photo Club. Daniel stepped in at the last minute as Don Toothaker, MNEC was originally scheduled to judge, but had a family emergency that required his attention. The final scoring was from 15 to 27 points per print with each judge scoring 5 to 9 points per print. When either Daniels's or Dianne's print came up for scoring, Daniel abstained from scoring

the prints and/or deciding on an award. The scores from the other two Judges were averaged and that was added as the third score to make the final score for the Carey's prints.

In the Monochrome Print category, the Best of Show - Monochrome award was given to Chane Cullens, HonNEC from the Flagpole Photographers of Newtown for his print Let the Milky Way Be the Guide Tonight. The J. Owen Santer Memorial Award for Best Landscape/Seascape print was awarded to Karen Fitzgerald from the Stoney Brook Camera Club for her print Fan Pier Sparkling. The Harold Ahern Memorial Award for the Best Monochrome Nature print was awarded to Robyn Abrams from the Flagpole Photographers of Newtown for her print Strike a Pose.

Each of the three judges gave an award for the monochrome print they liked the most. Michael Goodman, MNEC gave his Judge's Choice award to Roy Haddock from the Merrimack Valley Camera Club for his print Great Grey on the Hunt. Daniel Carey, MNEC gave his Judge's Choice award to Darcy Robinson from the Nashoba Valley Photo Club for her print Vervet Young Nuzzles for Comfort and Tara Marshal gave her Judge's Choice award to Rhonda Cullens, MNEC from the Flagpole Photographers of Newtown for her print Icy Cold.

Five Honor Awards in the Monochrome Print Category were given to Diane Carey, MNEC from the Nashoba Valley Photo Club for her print Manyara Monkey Baby Looking up to Mom, Katie Slawitschek from the Flagpole Photographers of Newtown for her print The Pout, Jutta Curtin from the Merrimack Valley Camera Club for her print Did You See That?, Linda Cullivan from the Portland Camera Club for her print Gray Heron, Kenya, and Karl Zuzarte, MNEC from the Photographic Society of Rhode Island for his print The Rushing Grebes.

In the Color Print category, the Best of Show - Color was awarded to Rhonda Cullens, MNEC from the Flagpole Photographers of Newtown for her print Fire and Ice. The Daniel Charbonnet Memorial Award for Best Photo Travel print was awarded to John Russo from the Greater Lynn Photographic Association for his print Massai Village Chief. The John Fuller Memorial Award for the Best Color Nature print was awarded to Kathy Murphy from the Greater Lynn Photographic Association for her print Polar Bear Mom and Cubs of the Year.

Each of the three judges gave an award for the color print they liked the most. Michael Goodman, MNEC gave his Judge's Choice award to Peter Flanagan from the Portland Camera Club for his print Fish for Dinner. Daniel Carey, MNEC gave his Judge's Choice award to Richard Kunsch, MNEC from the Greater Bridgeport Camera Club for his print Kyroshi Warriors and Tara Marshal gave her Judge's Choice award

to Daniel Carey, MNEC from the Nashoba Valley Photo Club for his print Red Fox in Winter.

Five Honor Awards in the Color Print Category were given to James Doucett from the Merrimack Valley Camera Club for his print Chimney Rock, Colorado, Diane Carey, MNEC from the Nashoba Valley Photo Club for her print Reddish Egret Fishing, Sandy Schill, MNEC from the Flagpole Photographers of Newtown for her print Tulips, Tom Armstrong from the Eastern Maine Camera Club for his print Hoar Frost Jeweled Crab Apple, and Karen Comppen from the Greater Lynn Photographic Association for her print Making an Entrance.

DIGITAL IMAGE INTERCLUB COMPETITIONS

All three competitions were held at the Greater Lynn Photographic Association Headquarters in Lynn, Massachusetts. The judging was open to the public and invitations to attend were sent to all the NECCC member clubs. The new category of

Monochrome which was implemented last year was split into two classes this year according to club placement for last year's competition. We had fifteen clubs in Class A and twenty-three clubs competing in Class B. We continued with the implemented changes in the rules regarding Nature, Color and Monochrome along with the same 6-15 point scoring system, which is easy for the judges to use quickly and allows for a faster judging.

In honor, and in memory, of Daniel Charbonnet, past President of NECCC, a memorial award for the Digital Interclub Image of the Year has been established. This award is for best of the best from the six winning Digital Interclub images. The winning image is: "Almost There" by James Brady, MNEC, Greater Lynn Photographic Assoc. (MA)

Congratulations to the clubs and individual winners. The winning images are posted on the NECCC website.

2025-26 Digital Competition: Next year's Interclub will continue with the same rules and regulations set up for this year. They will again be hosted by Greater Lynn and judged live in person at the Greater Lynn Headquarters. The images are projected on a 12-foot screen mounted to the wall and shown with a Canon Realis Projector mounted to the ceiling. We will continue doing three competitions: fall, winter and spring. Your chairman for 2025-26 will remain the same, BOD members Pam Lintner, HonNEC and Susan Mosser, HonFPSA, HonNEC. Due to a request from the clubs, we will however be changing the sizing of the images to a larger size of 1920 x 1080. You can still submit your images at 1400 x 1050 but they will appear a little smaller on the screen.

Class B Club that must move up to Class A in Color for 2025-26: - North Country Camera Club (NH)

Class B Club that must move up to Class A in Nature for 2025-26: - Cape Cod Art Center Camera Club (MA)

Class B Club that must move up to Class A in Monochrome for 2025-26: - Coastal Camera Club (CT)

We will also continue the choice we implemented last year to those Class A clubs who have been in Class A for a few years and are listed with year-end totals as one of the five lowest clubs who have competed with a full entry of 4 images per each of the three competitions for the year (total 12 images). You can now move back down to Class B if you wish, however you must stay in Class B for 2 years before being able to move back up to Class A, so you would need to consider this very carefully prior to asking to be moved back down. You would need to notify us prior to October 15, 2025 that you are moving down a class.

The dates for next year's competitions have been selected and are:

Fall- Saturday November 22, 2025 Winter-Saturday January 24, 2026 Spring- Saturday April 11, 2026

Images will still be due 2 weeks prior to the judging date so we may have time to correct any errors or incomplete entries with the clubs. A notice will be sent to all the clubs with a reminder of the due date. If your interclub director will change next year, please send me, Susan Mosser, the new name and contact information at s.jmosser@comcast.net so we are sure the correct person gets the information needed to compete.

Pam and I would personally like to thank Cindy Gosselin, HonNEC very much for her continued work on maintaining the updates to our master spreadsheet of all the

winning image titles, makers names, years and club names. This is a huge undertaking and we appreciate her willingness to continue to do it. We would also like to thank Rick Cloran, HonFPSA, HonNEC for all his technical help on the judging days, and for doing the set up at the club of the voting machine etc. along with Patrick Brosnan who assists in the recording of the judging and to Shiv Verma, FPSA, Hon NEC for cleaning up the recording and preparing it for posting on the website.
